Definitions

- Admission Policy means the official set of guidelines, criteria, and procedures governing admission to all programmes at MIT-WPU for the respective admission year.
- Private University means a University duly established through a State Act by a sponsoring body, i.e., a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, or any other corresponding law in force in a State, or a Public Trust, or a Company registered under Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- Class 10/ SSC means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination awarded by a recognized Board.
- Class 12/ 10+2/ HSC Examination means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination awarded by a recognized Board.
- Qualifying Examination means the examination conducted by an approved board or university, on the basis of which a candidate is considered eligible for admission.
- Application Form means the prescribed online form to be filled by an applicant seeking admission.
- Common Entrance Test (CET) means an entrance examination conducted at the National, State, or University level, the score of which may be used for admission purposes.
- Merit List means the list of candidates arranged according to their scores, percentile, percentage in entrance examinations or qualifying examinations, as applicable.
- Seat Allocation means the process of assigning seats to eligible candidates strictly based on merit, entrance examination performance, qualifying examination performance, programme eligibility, and seat availability.
- MIT-WPU CET means the Common Entrance Test conducted by university through online Computer-Based Test (CBT), and/ or Personal Interaction (PI) and/ or other assessments (Drawing Test, Portfolio Review, SoP, Media Report, etc.) depending on programme requirements.
- Personal Interaction (PI) means an interview conducted by MIT-WPU to assess a candidate's communication, analytical skills, subject knowledge, and overall suitability for the programme.



- Portfolio/ Creative Assessment means a collection of creative work (audio, video, photography, design, artwork, scripts, etc.) submitted by candidates applying for creative programmes such as Filmmaking, Photography, Design, and Fine Arts, which is assessed by a jury.
- Group Discussion (GD) means a part of the selection process where candidates are assessed on communication, analytical, and leadership skills through group exercises or impromptu speaking.
- Extempore is an assessment activity conducted during the admission or selection process to evaluate a candidate's ability to think, organize, and express ideas spontaneously on a given topic within a limited time. It helps assess communication skills, confidence, clarity of thought, presence of mind, and articulation—key attributes for academic and professional success.
- ♦ **Drawing Test** means a programme-specific test used in Design and Fine Arts admissions to evaluate creative ability and design aptitude.
- Media Report means a written and/ or audio-visual submission by the candidate, used for selection in Media and Communication programmes to assess analytical and communication skills.
- Sponsored Candidate means a candidate with a minimum of two years of fulltime work experience, counted after the declaration of the qualifying degree result and obtained in a registered firm, company, industry, educational/research institute, Government Department, or Government Autonomous Organization, in the relevant field in which admission is sought.
- Work Experience means full-time professional experience in a registered firm, company, industry, educational/ research institute, Government Department, or Government Autonomous Organization, completed only after graduation.
- Use Testing Agency (NTA) for the admissions to respective academic year.
- MHT-CET means the Maharashtra Higher & Technical Common Entrance Test, a state-level entrance exam conducted annually by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra, for admission to undergraduate programmes in the state.
- MHT-CET-B means the state-level entrance test conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra, for admission to undergraduate programmes in Pharmacy and Bioengineering.
- NEET means the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for admission to undergraduate programmes in Pharmacy and Bioengineering.
- PERA-CET means the Common Entrance Test conducted by self-financed universities in Maharashtra through the Preeminent Education and Research



- Association (PERA), Pune, registered under Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- BBA CET is a state-level entrance examination conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Government of Maharashtra, for admission to the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and allied management programmes.
- GATE is a national-level examination conducted in India, to assess the comprehensive understanding of candidates in various undergraduate-level programmes in Engineering, Technology, Architecture, Pharmacy and Science. The test serves as a qualifying examination for admission to postgraduate programmes (M.Tech., M.Pharm., etc.).
- ☼ XAT means the Xavier Aptitude Test, a national-level entrance exam for management programmes conducted by XLRI, Jamshedpur.
- ♥ CAT means the Common Admission Test, a national-level entrance exam for admission to management programmes, conducted by the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs).
- NMAT means the NMIMS Management Aptitude Test, a computer-based exam conducted by the Graduate Management Admission Council (GMAC) for admission to MBA programmes.
- MAH- MBA CET means the Maharashtra Common Entrance Test, also known as MAH MBA-CET, conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Government of Maharashtra, for admission to postgraduate management programmes (MBA).
- State Common Management Admission Test, a computer-based entrance exam for MBA programmes, conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).
- MAT means the Management Aptitude Test, a standardized entrance exam for MBA and other management programmes in India, conducted by the All-India Management Association (AIMA).
- SMAT means the Graduate Management Admission Test, a computer-based exam conducted by the Graduate Management Admission Council (GMAC).
- UCEED means the Undergraduate Common Entrance Examination, a national-level exam assessing aptitude test for admission to Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programmes.
- **CEED** means the Common Entrance Examination for Design, a joint entrance exam for postgraduate studies in the field of design.



- ♦ CLAT means the Common Law Admission Test, a national-level entrance exam conducted by the National Law Universities (NLUs) for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate law programmes.
- MAH MCA CET is a state-level entrance examination conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Government of Maharashtra, for admission to the first year of the Master of Computer Applications (MCA) programme.
- SPAT is a national-level entrance exam conducted by NBEMS for admission to M.Pharm programmes.
- NEET-AIIMS, or INI-CET, is a national-level entrance exam conducted by AIIMS for admission to postgraduate medical science programmes.
- NEET-MDS is a national-level entrance examination conducted by the National Board of Examinations for admission to postgraduate medical Science programmes.
- NATA (National Aptitude Test in Architecture) is a national-level entrance examination conducted for admission to undergraduate Architecture (B.Arch) programmes in India.
- Updates the preservation, by DigiLocker means a government-approved service for the preservation, retention, and delivery of electronic records to the subscriber.
- Online Payment Mode means electronic payment systems such as Net Banking, Debit/ Credit Card, or UPI (G-Pay), which transfer money from the candidate's account to the University's account.
- Programme means the field of study in Technical Education, such as Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Planning, Applied Arts and Crafts, Design, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, MCA, and Management, or any other programme as notified by law.
- ♦ Course means a branch of learning within a programme, such as Civil Engineering, BBA International Business (Hons.), etc.
- Eligibility Criteria means the minimum academic basic qualifications, entrance test requirements, and other conditions that a candidate must fulfil to be considered for admission.
- Equivalence Certificate means a document issued by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) or the relevant education board, certifying that the qualifications obtained from foreign, international, or other board(s) are equivalent to the corresponding Indian educational standards
- Provisional Admission means admission granted subject to the submission and verification of required documents or fulfilment of eligibility criteria within the stipulated time. Failure to do so shall lead to the cancellation of admission.




- Self-Registration means the online or offline process completed by the candidate after selection, which includes fee payment and submission of compulsory documents.
- PRN (Permanent Registration Number) means the unique student identification number allotted after completion of the admission and eligibility process.
- Scholarship means financial assistance provided to eligible students as per university norms, adjusted against fees and not disbursed in cash.
- Concession means financial assistance provided to eligible students under different categories (wards, alumni, PMSSS, defence, differently abled, GOI, Jammu & Kashmir migrant, etc), adjusted against fees and not disbursed in cash.
- International Candidate means a student holding Foreign National, OCI, PIO, CIWGC, CIWSEA, SAARC, or NRI status, applying under international admission as per university rules.
- A Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidate means a person displaced from the State of Jammu & Kashmir, including Kashmiri Pandits, non-Kashmiri Hindu families, and Muslim migrants, who are eligible for admission under the J&K Migrant quota as per statutory bodies, University guidelines. The Migrant Certificate is required.
- ♣ Foreign National means a citizen of a country other than India who holds a foreign passport and is not a Person of Indian Origin (PIO), Overseas Citizen of India (OCI), or Non-Resident Indian (NRI).
- UNGC candidates means who are children of Indian citizens working in Gulf countries and are eligible for admission under the CIWGC category as per government or university regulations.
- An Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) candidate means a person who holds an OCI card issued by the Government of India under Section 7(A) of the Citizenship Act, 1955, and is a citizen of another country but has been granted certain rights and privileges similar to Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) for the purpose of admission to educational institutions in India.
- Non-Resident Indian (NRI) candidate means an Indian citizen who resides outside India for employment, business, or vocation, or a person deputed abroad by the Government of India or an Indian public/private sector undertaking. The children or wards of such persons are eligible for admission under the NRI category as per applicable government or university rules.
- University Transfer means the process where a candidate transfers from another university or institute to MIT-WPU, along with credit transfer where applicable, subject to fulfilment of equivalence.



- Eligibility means the process or documentation that enables a student to secure admission to the chosen programme within university jurisdiction.
- Statement of Purpose (SoP) means a personal statement submitted with the admission form, outlining the applicant's background, academic/ professional interests, and potential contribution to the programme.
- Aggregate Marks means the overall percentage calculated on all subjects as per board/ university norms. Kindly note that MIT-WPU does not consider "best of five" subject scores for eligibility.
- Reserved Category (Maharashtra State) means categories notified by the Government of Maharashtra (SC, ST, VJ/ DT-NT, OBC, SBC, etc.) that are entitled to relaxation in eligibility criteria as per university norms.
- Migration Certificate means a certificate issued by the previous Board/ University confirming that the student has migrated from that respective institution/university.
- Transfer/ Leaving Certificate means an official document issued by the previous institution/ university certifying that the student has left that institution/ university.
- **Domicile Certificate** means a certificate issued by the competent authority confirming that the student is a resident of Maharashtra State.
- Section Caste Certificate (Maharashtra State) means a document issued by a competent authority in Maharashtra state certifying that the candidate belongs to a reserved category (SC, ST, VJ/ DT-NT, OBC, SBC, etc.).
- Caste Validity Certificate (Maharashtra State) means a certificate issued by the competent authority validating the authenticity of a caste claim.
- Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) Certificate (Maharashtra State) means a certificate issued by the competent authority confirming that the candidate belongs to the Non-Creamy Layer of a reserved category, applicable to OBC, VJ/ DT-NT, SBC, etc.
- Stamp paper explaining any academic gap between two consecutive years of study.
- Defence Certificate means a certificate in the prescribed format (Proforma I, II, III) for candidates claiming admission under the defence quota.
- Persons with Disability (PwD) Certificate means a certificate in the prescribed format (Proforma IV or V), issued by a competent medical authority validating disability status.




- ➡ J&K Migrant Certificate means a certificate in prescribed formats (Proforma-VI, VII, VIII) for candidates applying under the Jammu & Kashmir migrant quota.
- Undertaking means a written statement by the applicant and parent/ guardian (e.g., Proforma X) declaring pending submission of documents and abide to submit the same by due date undertake in the undertaking.
- Duration means the minimum time prescribed by statutory bodies/ university regulations to complete a programme, expressed in years/ semesters (e.g., 4 years/ 8 semesters).
- Sanctioned Intake vs. Supernumerary Seats means:
 - a. Sanctioned Intake regular seats approved for a programme.
 - b. Supernumerary Seats additional seats permitted for special categories such as NRI/ PIO/ International students, J&K migrants, or other government-mandated quotas.
- Annual Fees mean the total fee payable for one academic year of a programme.
- Refund Policy means the official University norms, governing refund of fees in case of admission withdrawal or cancellation.
- UGC means the University Grants Commission.



Admission Policy

Dr. Vishwanath Karad MIT World Peace University (MIT-WPU), Pune, is committed to deliver value-based, research-driven, and industry-oriented education. Since its inception, the University has set benchmarks in higher education, attracting students from across India and abroad.

With a strong focus on diversity, tolerance, and holistic development, MIT-WPU offers a transparent and merit-based admission process through national/ state-level entrance exams or the University's own assessments.

Admission Procedure

Indian Candidates

- Notifications and advertisements about the application forms and important dates will be published on the MIT-WPU website.
- ➤ Application forms can be filled out online on the MIT-WPU official website by paying the non-refundable ₹ 2,000/ for the entrance examination and/ or admission processing. This payment can be made through the online mode (Net Banking/ Card/ G-Pay, etc.)
- Admissions will be purely based on the Ranks/ Percentile/ Scores secured in the All-India National Level Entrance Tests/ Maharashtra CET/ MIT-WPU CET. The MIT-WPU CET is conducted by university through online mode which would be consistent with the online Computer Based Test (CBT) & Personal Interaction (PI)/ Media Report/ SoP/ Drawing Test/ Portfolio (as applicable) and based on suitable eligibility criteria program-wise.
- > The Results of the selection will be published on the individual applicant dashboard.
- ➤ Eligible candidates will be allocated programmes based on their ranks/ Percentile/ Scores in the respective entrance examinations, and/ or qualifying examinations as per eligibility & the merit cut-offs defined for the relevant selection process.

International Candidates

Admissions will be based on marks/grades in the qualifying examination and seat availability, considering the following:

 Academic Eligibility: As prescribed by MIT-WPU/ UGC / State Government norms.



- **English Language Requirement:** Medium of Instruction (MOI-English) or valid IELTS/TOEFL/PTE score.
- Passport & Visa: Valid passport, Indian Student Visa, and mandatory FRRO registration.
- **Required Documents:** Passport, academic transcripts, certificates, photographs, visa copy, medical fitness certificate, and proof of funds.
- Seat Allotment: Seats will be allotted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Application Submission - Online

The application shall be submitted via the website. Link: https://mitwpu.edu.in/

Candidates must carefully enter their personal information and contact details (email address and mobile number), as all important updates will be sent only to the registered email ID and mobile number.

Important instructions regarding the entrance test, personal interaction, and selection process will be communicated from time to time. Candidates are advised to regularly check their registered email ID as well as the official MIT-WPU website for updates.

Important instructions for filling the online application form.

- Personal Profile: The name of the candidate and their parents must exactly match the name mentioned on the Class 10 marksheet/ certificate. No prefixes should be used.
- Registered Contact Details: Please ensure the contact details (email address and mobile number) mentioned in the application form are accurate.
- Academic Profile: Candidates must enter the marks obtained in the qualifying examinations (Class 10, Class 10+2, bachelor's degree, etc.). If the qualifying examination result(s) are not declared at the time of application, the marks must be updated in the application within 5 days from the date of result declaration. Similarly, the scores of National Level Entrance Test(s)/ Maharashtra CET (as applicable) must be updated in the application form within 5 days of the result declaration.


Candidates are also required to upload the scorecard(s) of the respective entrance examination(s) and marksheet(s) of the qualifying examination(s). Applications without the qualifying marks/ entrance test scores and required documents will not be considered for the further selection process.

• SoP (Statement of Purpose): The SoP should be submitted through online mode in the application form (wherever applicable). A SoP, also known as a letter of intent/video, is written statement addressed to the admission panel and can be



talks about your career path, interests, professional contributions, goals, and the driving force behind pursuing a particular Pedagogy/ Programme.

- **Upload Documents:** We prefer required documents downloaded through DigiLocker or self-attested scanned and readable copies in the application form. The documents downloaded through DigiLocker/ Readable self-attested scanned documents to be kept handy while submitting the application form.
- Payment of the application ₹2,000/ for the entrance examination and/ or admission processing must be made online (Net Banking, Debit/ Credit Card, UPI, etc.). The fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.
- Latest Photograph: Candidates must upload their latest passport-size photograph, which will be used for official records such as the student ID card and other documents.




- Seat allocation is based on merit in the National Entrance Examination/ Maharashtra CET/ MIT-WPU CET, etc.
- For Programmes where CET is not applicable, allocation will be based on the marks obtained in board/ degree examinations.
- MIT-WPU will not be responsible if a candidate fails to attend the entrance test, admission round, or counselling round on the scheduled date and time.
- No requests for changes in the date of the entrance test, admission round, or counselling round will be entertained under any circumstances.
- Seat allocation will depend on merit and availability of vacant seat(s).
- The merit result Status will be communicated as follows: -

Minimum 3 points required in each DP subject. Cambridge International (CAIE) board awarded "A" Levels (12 equivalent). An equivalence or conversion certificate from the respective board (IB-DP/ IB-CP/ ICSE/ CAIE)/ AIU is mandatory in cases where the results are issued in grades or credit points.
- PG Programmes: The candidate must have a Batchelor's Degree or its equivalent Degree from any recognized University approved by the UGC/ AIU.
 - 1. Maharashtra state (MS) Candidates -

A Candidate who is either **Domicile** of Maharashtra and/ or is **born** in Maharashtra.

2. Other than Maharashtra state (OMS) Candidates -

A candidate whose Domicile Status is outside Maharashtra and has passed his qualifying examination from Board/ University outside Maharashtra will be considered as OMS candidate.

AND/ OR

A candidate whose Domicile Status is outside Maharashtra state but passing Class 10/ SSC, Class 12/ HSC, Diploma, Graduation, or Post-Graduation or its equivalent examination from a recognized school in the State of Maharashtra, will be considered as OMS candidate.

University Transfers

MIT-WPU offers lateral entry admissions to second-year undergraduate programmes across various streams. This provides an excellent opportunity for aspirants who wish to transfer from another recognized university after completing their first year and continue their academic journey at MIT-WPU.



- The candidates will be offered programme based on the availability of vacant seats.
- The basic eligibility criteria for university transfer admission includes securing First Class in the First Year with no backlogs, as well as obtaining First Class in both Class 10+2/ Diploma and Class 10 examinations.
- Candidates can fill out the University Transfer form available on the online application portal of MIT-WPU.
- If the number of applications received is more than the vacant seat(s) in the programme/ course, the admissions will be offered based on merit.
- Applications for Second Year admission at MIT-WPU will be considered based on the equivalence of subjects and syllabus studied by the candidate in the First Year at the previous institution, as compared with those prescribed in the First-Year curriculum of MIT-WPU.
- The MIT-WPU equivalence committee's decision will be final for offering the Second-Year University Transfer Admission.
- If the candidate fails to submit the attested copy of First-Year result along with the syllabus of the previous university, the application will not be considered for further admission processing.
- All disputes related to university transfer admissions shall be addressed exclusively through the University's Student Grievance Redressal Mechanism.

Important instructions for University Transfer admissions:

The candidate must submit the following documents to MIT-WPU within 10 days from the date of admission to confirm the admission.

- 1. Original Leaving or Transfer Certificate issued by the previous Institution/ University.
- 2. A Migration Certificate issued by your previous University.
- 3. Attested copy of results- First Year, Class 10+2 and Class 10 examinations.
- 4. A copy of the Aadhar card and Permanent address proof.

International Candidate

- along with all mandatory IBCP core components and a recognized career-related study with at least 3 subjects. Minimum 3 points required in each DP subject. Cambridge International (CAIE) board awarded "A" Levels (12 equivalent).
- An equivalence or conversion certificate from the respective board (IB-DP/ IB-CP/ ICSE/ CAIE)/ AIU is mandatory in cases where the results are issued in grades or credit points.
- Post-Graduate (PG) Programmes: The candidate must have a Batchelor's Degree or its equivalent Degree from any recognized University approved by the UGC/ AIU.

MIT-WPU follows UGC-specified eligibility norms while reviewing international students' admission applications. To take admission for any programme at MIT-WPU under international category, the admission categories of international candidates are as mentioned below:

- A. Foreign Nationals Students: A student is eligible to apply as a Foreign National (FN) if he/ she is a citizen of any country other than India and holds a foreign passport (FN SAARC countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and FN-Non-SAARC Countries).
- **B. CIWGC/ CIWSEA Students:** Children of Indians working in Gulf Countries & Southeast Asian countries, (the candidates whose parents are working at Gulf countries or Southeast Asian countries) only are eligible under this category.
- **C. OCI Students:** A student is eligible to apply as OCI if he/ she has been granted Overseas Citizenship of India and has an OCI card.
- **D.** NRI: A student is eligible for admission under the NRI category if he/ she is sponsored by an NRI who is an immediate or close relative. The following relations shall be considered eligible sponsors:
 - Father or Mother of the candidate.
 - Real Brother or Sister of the candidate.
 - Paternal Grandfather or Grandmother.
 - Maternal Grandfather or Grandmother.
 - Real Brother or Sister of Father (Paternal Uncle/ Aunt).
 - Real Brother or Sister of Mother (Maternal Uncle/ Aunt).

5. Scholarships to Elite Sportsperson: These scholarships are awarded to deserving sports persons based on their participation/ winning the prizes at Nationally/ Internationally recognized sports competitions/ events.

Any candidate who participates/ wins a medal at west zone inter-university, all India inter-university, national or international level, while representing MIT-WPU or playing for any Govt. sponsored/ Govt. recognized official sports organization [IOA, BCCI, etc.]; in any nationally/ internationally recognized sporting event; in individual or team sports; would be eligible for the following scholarship for the remaining period of the Programme, only if he/ she participates and wins a medal on the National/ International Level.

If the student has secured a top 5 ranking position in a tournament (Badminton, Chess, Table Tennis, Shooting, Archery etc.) conducted by or affiliated with a recognized govt. sponsored/ Govt. official sports organization or federation at National or International level, then he/ she will be eligible for the participation scholarship.

As per the Academic calendar, (i.e., from 1st June – 31st May), if a student has secured a medal/ rank in his 12th std. then he/ she can apply for the scholarship, provided all the criteria is met, in the 1st year itself. Securing a rank in 1st year, will result in a scholarship being awarded in the 2nd year and so on. In case, a student is in the last academic year, then he/ she can apply for a reimbursement in the same academic year only.

Note: An individual or team winning at West Zone, All India level, National or International level would be eligible for any one concession (whichever is higher).

6. Hon'ble Shri. T N Seshan Scholarship: This special scholarship is offered to candidates admitted to the School of Government.

The students at the School of Government who are the wards of in-service public servants with a minimum of 5 years of experience in government service shall receive the "Hon'ble Sri. T N Seshan Scholarship" which amounts to 15% of the Programme fee.



7. International Scholarship: This scholarship is offered to students from the CIWGC, CIWSEA, OCI and Foreign Nationals candidates. International Scholarship cannot be clubbed with any other scholarship.

The criteria for awarding the scholarships for various Programmes and categories are given in the subsequent paragraphs.

- For all international candidates, 50% of domestic fee waiver will be awarded by MIT-WPU in the form of a scholarship (except NRI Category).
- > All scholarships will be awarded on A FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED BASIS.
- ➤ Academic performance & attendance should be maintained throughout every year for the continuation of the scholarship.

Fee Concession

1. Wards of MIT-WPU/ MAEER's Staff Members:

- ➤ This fee concession policy shall apply to the wards and spouses of faculty or staff members who have completed a minimum of three (3) years of continuous service in any Institute, College, or University under MAEER's, as on the date of admission at the entry level.
- ➤ The fee concession applies for the entire duration of the programme, subject to the student having no active backlogs and maintaining the required academic performance and attendance as per university norms
- ➤ If the faculty/ staff leaves the organisation due to termination/ resignation or any other reason, the applicable fees for that year onward shall be payable in full. The fee concession won't be applicable.
- > To claim for the fee concession under this policy, the student must obtain a minimum of 60% marks in the basic qualifying examination at the entry level.
- The fee concession under this policy will be determined based on the employee's monthly gross salary. In cases where both parents of the applicant are employed within the MAEER's Group, the higher gross salary of the parents will be considered for determining the applicable salary range. The percentage of concession will then be applied as per the slabs mentioned below.

Above 50000	50%

- The student should get selected & admitted through the MIT-WPU admission scrutiny/ process.
- The student must progress to the next level without any live backlog.



2. Alumni:

- Any Alumni or Spouse of Alumni or Ward of Alumni (son/ daughter) from any School/ College/ University of MAEER Group who takes admission to MIT-WPU will be eligible for a scholarship of 10% provided he/ she score a minimum of 60% marks/ grade in the qualifying examination at entry level.
- ➤ The fee concession applies for the entire duration of the programme, subject to the student having no active backlogs and maintaining the required academic performance and attendance as per university norms.

3. Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS):

- ➤ The candidate admitted directly through AICTE under PMSSS, will have to pay the international study tour cost component, either at the time of admission or before the tour, if he/ she wishes to go for the international study tour. This international study tour shall be completely optional for students admitted under the PMSSS quota.
- ➤ To avail this scholarship/ fee concession, the candidate must apply under the said scheme. The scholarship/ concession shall be limited to the difference between the total fee of the program and the amount reimbursed by AICTE.

4. Defence:

- ➤ Wards of personnel working in or retired from the Defence Services/ Paramilitary services are eligible for a fee concession across the duration of the programme. The fee concession would be 25% for the wards of Non-Commissioned Officers (NCO's), 15% for the wards of Junior Commissioned Officers (JCO's) & 10% for the wards of Senior Commissioned Officers.
- > The fee concession applies for the entire duration of the programme, subject to the student having no active backlogs and maintaining the required academic performance and attendance as per university norms.

5. Differently Abled Student:

- > Students with 40% & higher disability will be given fee concession amounting to up to 40% of fees, depending upon disability. The disability must be certified by a medical authority specified by the government.
- The fee concession applies for the entire duration of the programme, subject to the student having no active backlogs and maintaining the required academic performance and attendance as per university norms.



6. GOI (Government of India) Student:

- ➤ Seats allocated through Central Seat Allocation Board for North-Eastern States & Union Territories [CSAB NEUT] to be conducted by NIT.
- Fee Concession equal to 50% on the total fee will be granted for the entire Programme duration. It will be subject to good behaviour, discipline & passing in university examinations.
- > Students availing this fee concession will not be eligible to apply for any other scholarships/ concession offered by MIT-WPU, except for Rank Holder or Elite Sportsman Scholarships.
- The fee concession applies for the entire duration of the programme, subject to the student having no active backlogs and maintaining the required academic performance and attendance as per university norms.

7. Jammu & Kashmir Migrant:


- Under the J&K Migrant Quota, only one seat per course will be allotted based on merit. This seat will be over and above the regular approved intake for the respective programme.
- ➤ 50% fee concession will be granted for the entire duration of Programme. It will be continued subject to good behaviour, discipline & passing in university examinations and fulfilment of university norms.
- > Students availing this fee concession will not be eligible to apply for any other scholarships/ concession offered by MIT-WPU, except for Rank Holder or Elite Sportsman Scholarships, concession etc.

Terms and Conditions to award and continuation of the Scholarships:

- Scholarship shall be awarded to eligible students on a first-come, first-served basis.
- ➤ The number of scholarships is being awarded proportionate to actual admissions and not more than percentage of the approved intake of the respective Programme.
- > Scholarship is not awarded in cash but is adjusted in the fees.
- ➤ If there are more eligible candidates for one scholarship slab, the overflow from the allocated scholarship candidates will be shifted to the next slab of the Scholarships.
- No two scholarships will be given concurrently except the scholarship for the MAEER/ MIT-WPU Employee concession and Alumni concession. In such cases the total amount of the scholarship/ concession should not exceed 75% of the total academic fees.
- Academic Performance (Domestic): To continue the scholarship for the total duration of the Programme, the student should maintain a minimum



- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 8.0 and above of every year with no live backlogs in any subject/ programme and no semester break.
- ➤ Academic Performance (OCI/ CIWGC/ CIWSEA/ FN): To continue the scholarship for the total duration of the Programme, the student should maintain a minimum CGPA of 6.0 and above, throughout all semesters of every year.
- ➤ Attendance: The student must maintain a minimum attendance of 80% per semester after catering for all exigencies including illness, sports, and any other requirement. (75% minimum attendance for International Category Students).
- ➤ **Discipline:** The student must maintain good conduct, behaviour, and discipline as per the Code of Conduct of the University. For any violations of the University Code of Conduct, the student will be issued a written warning/memo leading to forfeiting of the scholarship immediately for ongoing as well as the subsequent years.
- In case of cancellation of admission, the scholarship would stand 'null & void', and the student must pay back the total fee waiver given to him/ her by the University till the time of cancellation of admission.
- ➤ MIT-WPU reserves the right to utilise the scholarship awardee for promotional activities.



- In addition to the programme fees mentioned above, students are required to pay a processing fee of ₹ 20,000 or \$ 300. This fee is a one-time payment due at the time of application and is non-refundable. All programme fees listed above are on an annual basis.
- > 100% Scholarship is applicable ONLY for Foreign National students on a first-come, first-served basis (Limited Seats)- Eligibility is 10th/ 12th/ Graduation with minimum 80% marks or equivalent (see Scholarship on website for more details).
- > Scholarship/ fee concession is not applicable for NRI students.
- > Scholarships are applicable for full Programme duration (see Scholarship Eligibility criteria on website for more details).
- Hons.-Eligible students who opt for 4th Year of Undergraduate Programme will be awarded Honours Programme as per New Education Policy.
- For the Integrated B.Tech after 10th (6 years: Diploma + Degree), no exit option is available due to the integrated nature of the programme.
- Rural, National Academic and Global Academic Immersions are not part of Standard Fee Structure (where applicable).
- NRI and FN category will have the fees option of two Installments, whereas CIWGC, CIWSEA & OCI will have to pay the fee in one instalment.
- BA (Hons.)/ B.Sc. (Hons.): Major/ Minor in various areas of studies and more.



Annexure 4: Fees Payment Policy

Introduction

This policy outlines the procedures and guidelines for students who choose to pay their university fees in Installments. It aims to provide clarity on the deduction process, penalties for late payments and the academic implications of delayed payments. This policy ensures that all students are aware of the consequences of late payments and the utilization of collected penalties for student welfare activities.

Scope

This policy applies to all students at the university who opt to pay their fees in multiple Installments. It covers the payment structure, penalty mechanisms, academic consequences of late payments and guidelines for fee refund after admission cancellation.

Objectives

- To provide a clear structure for fee payments in Installments.
- To ensure timely collection of fees to maintain the university's financial health.
- To impose standardized penalties for late payments to encourage timely fee payment.
- To utilize collected penalties for student welfare activities.
- To align with UGC guidelines for admission cancellations.

Policy Details

Fee Payment Structure

The University shall adhere to all necessary and timely guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) regarding the payment and refund of fees while processing any student's fee-related issues.

Students who choose to pay their fees in multiple Installments will have the components of their fees deducted sequentially as outlined below:

- i. Deduction of Tuition Fees
- ii. Deduction of Exam Fees
- iii. Deduction of outstanding Penalty (If any)

Penalty for Late Fee Payment

- i. A penalty of Rs. 250/ per day will be imposed for late fee payments. This fine is a fixed amount and does not vary based on the number of Installments.
- ii. The penalty is not imposed on the Examination Fees of the university.

Utilization of Penalty Amount

The amount collected from student's penalties will be utilized exclusively for Students Welfare activities.

Attendance and Continuous Assessment

Any loss of attendance or class continuous assessment due to late payment of fees will remain to be the individual responsibility of the student and will not be compensated.

Admission Cancellation

The admission cancellation process will be in adherence with the yearly guidelines provided by the MIT-WPU and University Grants Commission (UGC).



Cancellation of Admission & Refund of Fee Policy

MIT-WPU will consider any request for cancellation/ withdrawal of admission from students only if such a request is made by the regulations prescribed by the university. The regulations include the procedure for cancellation/ withdrawal of admission as well as the rules for refunds.


- A request for cancellation of admissions must be sent through the registered email of the candidate to the email address mentioned in the offer guide or from the University Student Portal. No other method will be accepted.
- A refund will be made as per the university norms which is aligned with the UGC norms.
- A refund will be made only after the submission and verification of the proof of fee paid, the provisional seat and the allotment letter. The refund will be made through an account transfer to the account number mentioned in the withdrawal



- request. Hence, the correct bank account details must be provided in the withdrawal request.
- A refund would be considered only in respect of the Programme/ Academic Fee paid by the applicant. No refund shall be allowed in respect of Application Fees, entrance examination, or any other levies.
- In case the student fails to fulfil the eligibility criterion, then the student must communicate the same to the university within 10 days from the date of the declaration of the result from the concerned Board or University. (If the student fails to do that and the seat remains vacant, then the university will refund the fee paid after deducting ₹ 10,000/ -; else no refund shall be admissible)

Important Notes

- All refunds shall be remitted only to the bank account of the student/ parent as per the NEFT details furnished by the applicant and shall be made within 30 working days from the date of approval of the cancellation or withdrawal.
- If the student has submitted a fake score, then the student is liable to be cancelled for the admission, without any intimation and without refund of fees at any stage during his tenure at the university. In such cases, legal action may be taken.


