#### **EMPOWERING LOCAL COMMUNITY THROUGH EDUCATION**

The Department of Education's students participated in a Rural Immersion Program in Kule in January 2023. During the program, the first-year M.Ed. student, Sampada Joshi, visited the library of a secondary school in the village and donated story and language games to the school children. Following the program, she has been visiting Kule once a week and has been conducting spoken English classes for one hour each week for students in grades 8-10. The school authorities, including Principal Mr. Kedari, have extended their support and cooperation for this initiative.









Dr. Anandibai Joshi was a trailblazing Indian physician, widely regarded as the first Indian woman to have earned a degree in western medicine.

She was born in 1865 in Maharashtra and was married off at the young age of nine to a widower thrice her age. The death of her baby due to the lack of access to medical practitioners provoked her to pursue a degree in medicine. Anandibai faced a lot of cultural and societal barriers when she decided to pursue her education. But she remained determined and sailed to the United States in 1883 where she earned her degree of Doctor of Medicine from the Women's Medical College of Pennsylvania in 1886, becoming the first Indian woman to do so.

Dr. Joshi's achievement in obtaining a medical degree at a time when women's education was not encouraged, let alone in a foreign country, was nothing short of remarkable. She dedicated her life to the betterment of women's health in India, where the situation was deplorable. Dr. Joshi firmly believed that educating women and making healthcare accessible to them was the key to improving their status in society.

Unfortunately, Dr. Joshi's life was cut short due to tuberculosis in 1887, at the young age of 21. However, her legacy lives on, inspiring countless women to pursue their dreams, regardless of the obstacles in their way.
















## STHAPTHI TO MODERNITY: MIT-WPU's Nirmitee 2023 Spotlights Innovative Solutions for Construction Challenges

MIT-WPU students attend prestigious **HEEP** program at **John Hopkins University** 





