Department of Examinations conducts a successful workshop on CO-PO Mapping and Project-Based Learning

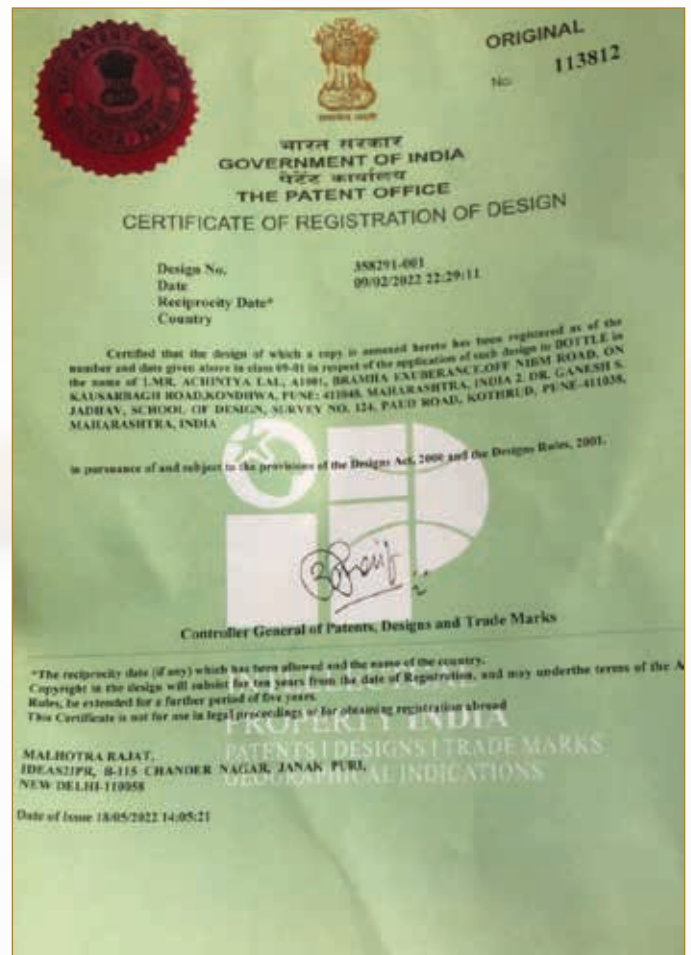

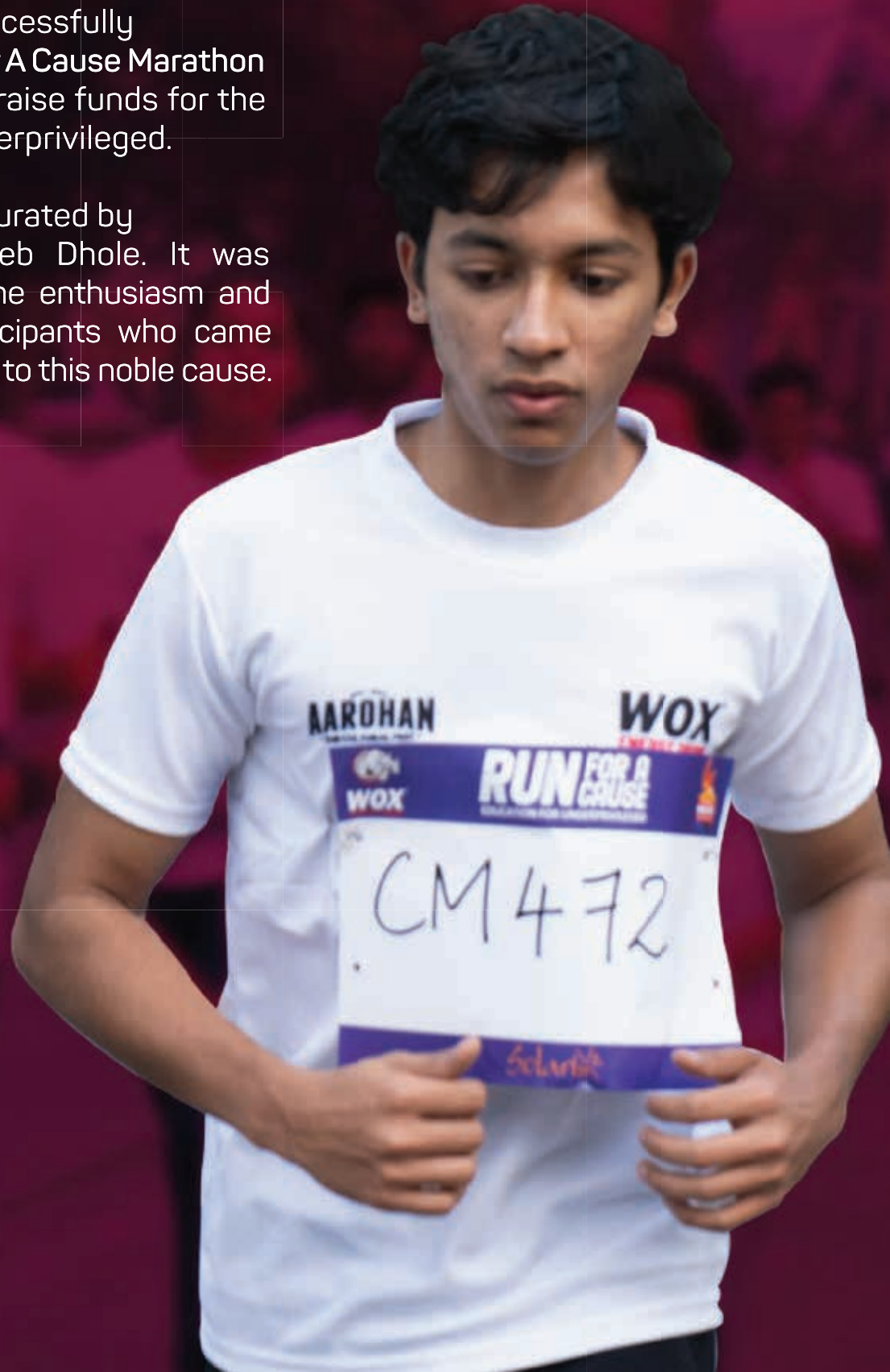


RUN FOR EDUCATION

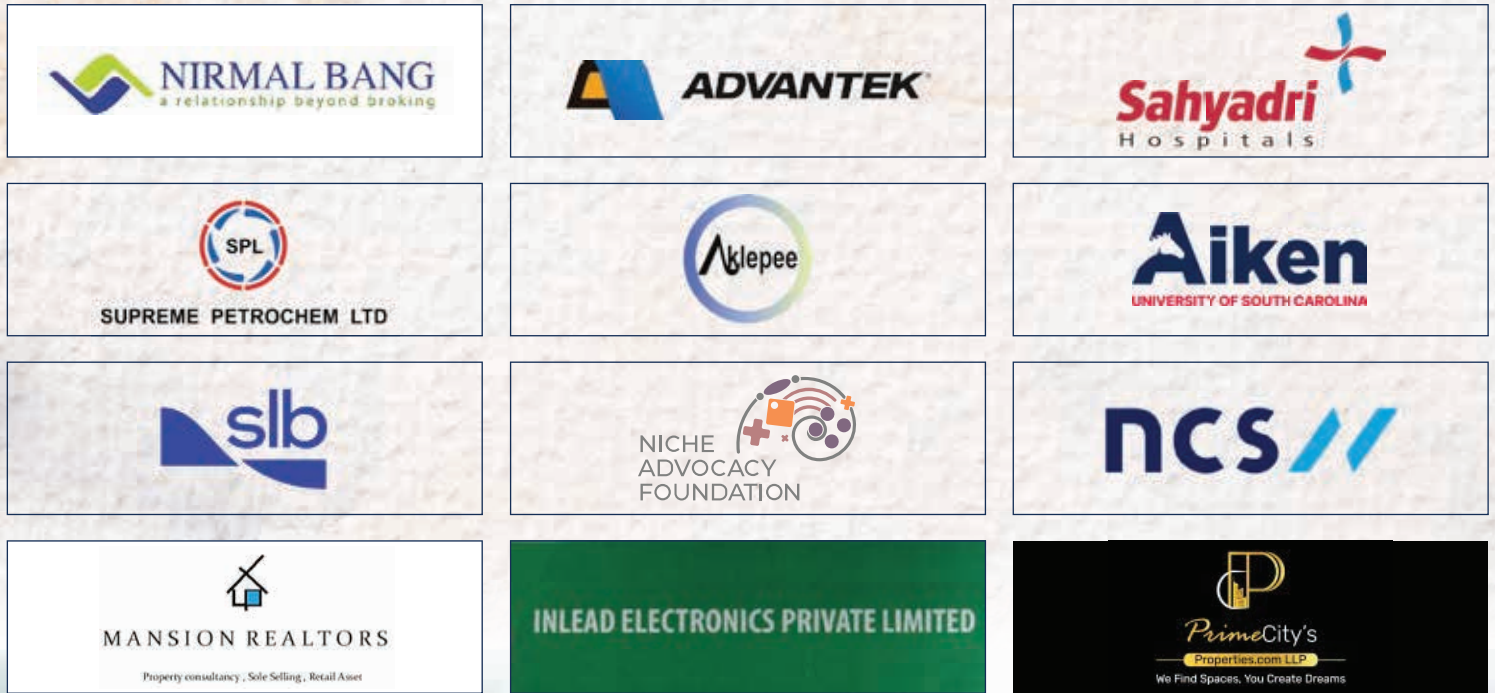

From My Dream to Our Dream

As a 20-year-old aspiring academician, it was my dream to pursue an M.Phil/Ph.D. in Political Science from the esteemed Jawaharlal Nehru University. The thought of being able to meet, and interact with scholars from different walks of life, within a university campus that did not imprison my mind or movements – when the clock struck 10 pm! was an ideal that I longed to be a part of.

We were in the peak of midsummer dreams of May 2012, with only two days at my disposal to prepare for my last M.A. final paper and subsequent JNU entrance tests. On that very fateful day, a meteorite called acute conjunctivitis struck me so hard that I lost 70 per cent of my vision, overnight. Panicked to the core, I screamed at the top of my voice! Fellow hostel-mates rushed to my room and in equal disbelief of the situation hurriedly took me to an eye clinic where I was rendered temporarily partially blind due to acute conjunctivitis. My world came crashing down after it spun quite vicariously & I was inconsolable to state the least. I was asked to return to my hometown with immediate effect for better care, but I just didn't want to give up on a dream I had nurtured since my teenage years.

In this crucial hour of life, it was the bonds of friendship and sisterhood I forged in Delhi University's postgraduate women's hostel that came to my rescue. My hostel mates and partners in intellectual debates, overnight addas and mischief-making, were closely aware of my dreams and desire to pursue an M.Phil and Ph.D. They too had their share of entrance examinations and tests to study for, nevertheless, this did not hold them back from collectively choosing to step up as my primary caregivers and mentors during these moments of utmost distress. Each and every hostel mate ensured that my daily mundane activities were carefully and patiently supervised and taken in the most organised way possible. From a timely reading of my hand-written notes, which isn't an easy task given my painfully illegible scribbling that ran across pages – to taking turns to bathe me, feed me medicines, pack my lunch bags and offering pick-up and drop services to my entrance exam venue, they did all of it!

An experience that has been etched in my memory forever due to the invaluable lessons on the labour of love, care, empathy and social justice that I gained from all of them. As my fellow competitors, they had the lucrative choice of keeping themselves out of this rather complex hurdle that life mercilessly threw at me. Yet, they collectively, as well as individually chose to believe in a just and common good, that did not exclude me from tasting the sweet fruits of higher education that I too deserved. I cleared my M.Phil/Ph.D. entrance in Political Science with enviable scores and made it into the top-10 ranks of JNU's merit list, only because of the power of the collective, our shared love, friendship, and ideals of creating a just and level-playing field for each one of us according to our needs, capabilities, strengths, limitations that fuelled on unceasing wilful determination to achieve our dreams.

I owe my JNU Dream to my hostel mates and their lofty acts of kindness and selflessness driven by a passionate zeal for both practising and preaching social justice, not just in the public domains of their academic work but in their private domains too. I consider myself to be fortunate to have forged such beautiful bonds of sisterhood at an impressionable age and wish the same for my dear, dear, students. I hope they find their collectives of mischief, learning and debates that continue to inspire and support them at every crucial juncture of their rich lives.
