





Save Earth, Save Life

Divyanshu Pawar, a second-year student of the MSc Ecology, Society & Sustainable Development program from the Faculty of Sustainability Studies, MIT-WPU has been awarded the prestigious Inlaks Ravi Sankaran Fellowship.

The Inlaks Ravi Sankaran Fellowship is a highly competitive fellowship, given to three chosen individuals from all over India applicants. The fellowship is given in the memory of the late Dr. Ravi Sankaran, a renowned conservationist, to encourage young conservationists of India.



The fellowship was awarded to Divyanshu for a project titled Mapping and Assessing of Ecohydrology and EValuating Ecosystem Services and Threats of the Tri-State Myristica Swamps in India. The fellowship includes a sum of INR 2,00,000/- for project implementation and human resources.

The proposed project will assess the status of the Myristica swamps of Maharashtra, Goa, and Karnataka States. Myristica swamps are a unique, ancient freshwater swamp habitat that supports several endemic species. The project will be instrumental in providing conservation recommendations to safeguard the rare ecosystem.

Vasudev Balwant Phadke: Father Of Indian Armed Rebellion

The fiercest armed rebellion after the war of 1857 was the rebellion of Vasudev Balwant Phadke that took place in Pune & Kalyan between 1875-1879.

Vasudev Balwant Phadke was born on 4 November 1845 in Shirdhon village, Maharashtra. He worked as a clerk in the military accounts department in Pune after he completed his graduation.

Phadke was greatly disturbed by the plight of the nation & the society. He realised that the harsh socioeconomic policies of the colonial government were pushing society into serious deprivation. British government's apathy & their oppressive economic policies during the Great Famine of 1876–1878 shook him to the core. Vasudev, then went on tour through Deccan urging people to join the fight for Swaraj. The educated & the elite classes gave him a cold shoulder, but the backward communities like Ramoshis, Kolis, Bhils and Dhangars showed him massive support. He gathered a band

of around 300 men & taught them to shoot, ride and fence. He was finally ready to take on the British head-on.

Padhke chose the "Robinhood model" to fight the British. He & his band raided the British treasury, looted the unfairly collected tax & distributed it among the famine-stricken villagers. Many such raids were carried out in areas around Pune. These raids tormented the British day after day & sucked the living daylights out of them. One of the most successful of these attacks was when he took complete control of the city of Pune for a few days. Support for Phadke's cause grew & numbers of his band members swelled.

The activities sent shockwaves throughout the British Empire, and the news of his exploits reached England. Petrified, the British officials announced a hefty bounty. This move, unfortunately, worked. Phadke was betrayed & was finally captured on 20th July 1879.

He was sentenced to life and transported to jail in Aden in Yemen. Here, Phadke underwent a hunger strike and breathed his last on 17th February 1883.

In the coming days, Vasudev Balwant Phadke became an inspiration for armed revolutionaries across the nation. His acts of valour even inspired the plot of Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay's famous novel Anandamath (1882). He is, therefore, rightly addressed as Father Of Indian Armed Rebellion.

Lighting Lives




Lighting although essential for our Existence, Comfort and Safety, still unfortunately it is taken Lightly. The subject of Lighting is understood by few and misunderstood by many.
