In 2005, under the mentorship of Mr. T. N. Seshan, former Chief Election Commissioner of India, we started MIT School of Government (MIT-SOG), with the idea that youth aspiring to make careers in myriad fields of politics should have a formal training center, where they would not just get rudimentary knowledge of "Government" and "Governance," but would also learn to become tomorrow's leaders committed to strengthening the democratic institutions of our country. The idea is to nurture and create political leaders of great substance who, irrespective of their political ideologies, will provide an able and effective leadership to the country.

More than two decades later, over 450 of our alumni are occupying significant positions in various political parties. We had started this Program at a time when politics was considered a not so good career. But now, with the engagement of youth in various movements and democratic processes in recent years, our belief stands vindicated. We remain committed to the cause of building a strong political leadership for the country. Similarly, through the Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad, which is the largest classrooms in the country, we train and groom nearly 10,000 participants from all states of India, emphasizing the need to strengthen the democratic institutions through politics.

Legislature and bureaucracy are two arms of a functioning democracy, who have to work complementary to each other for effective governance. To be a part of India's bureaucracy with the aim to serve the country, the aspirants have to succeed in the extremely tough and trying Civil Services Examination. For the last 15 years, our institution felicitates the successful candidates of the Civil Services examinations in the country, followed by an interactive session with the young minds.

We salute youth like you, who, in today's time choose to pursue a career with a commitment to serve the nation. This humble practice of felicitation of qualifiers of Civil Services Examination, which began in 2009, is our way of showing appreciation and faith in the system and its stakeholders. We see you playing a very important role through this coveted service and become nation-builders in the truest sense of the term. I am sure our effort to bring all of you on a single platform will inspire thousands of others who aspire to bring good governance and contribute to the nation through All India Civil Services.

Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad

We expanded the canvas of MIT School of Government in 2011, by creating a separate platform and brought out the classroom training of the School to the thousands of common youth through an innovative platform, Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad (BCS).

This is an apolitical outfit and does not engage in any mainstream political activity. It is transforming the outlook of youth and reaffirming their respect for politics, political leaders, democracy and its institutions. 10 to 12,000 politically and socially active students from 450 universities from all states of India participate at its flagship annual national conclave. A number of political leaders, engaging thinkers, intellectual giants, industrial leaders and youth icons of national and international eminence, from all walks of life and spectrum of ideologies provide them the context, analysis, courage, insight and perspective so that they can dream bigger, see clearer and speak louder.

National Legislators' Conference

National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat) is a platform of Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs) across the nation gathered for the first time at one place for exchanging ideas. The first edition of NLC Bharat took place in Mumbai from 15th to 17th June 2023, where MLAs and MLCs from the political parties and all the States and UTs were presented with a unique opportunity to interact with one other. The conference was conducted with the objectives of cross-learning and enhancement of legislative effectiveness at its core. The legislators gained experiential learning through a mix of thematic discussions and thoughtfully curated large-format plenary sessions along with brainstorming parallel sessions amongst the legislators. NLC Bharat also showcased States' and UTs' pavilions, their commendable practices, and led to extensive informal interactions amongst the legislators, party leaders and business-industry leaders. Sessions on strengthening democracy with the participation of acclaimed national and global leaders also took place during the conference. The conference provided a platform to the MLAs and MLCs to creatively showcase the cultural flavour of their region. NLC Bharat proved to be a true celebration and reflection of democracy and its strength- its elected representatives!

National Women's Parliament

Rashtriya Sarpanch Sansad

Rashtriya Sarpanch Sansad is a unique initiative taken by Shri Rahul V Karad, Executive President-MIT WPU, Founder BCS, NTC, NWP and MIT School of Government. The objective is to bring together Sarpanch, Government, Media and Experts with a long-term Vision of Rural Development. Sarpanch are key public representatives at the grassroots level for effective implementation of the policies of the central and state governments.
