To be a leader in providing best in class, future ready talent to the industry by creating a strong and two-way collaboration between academia & industry



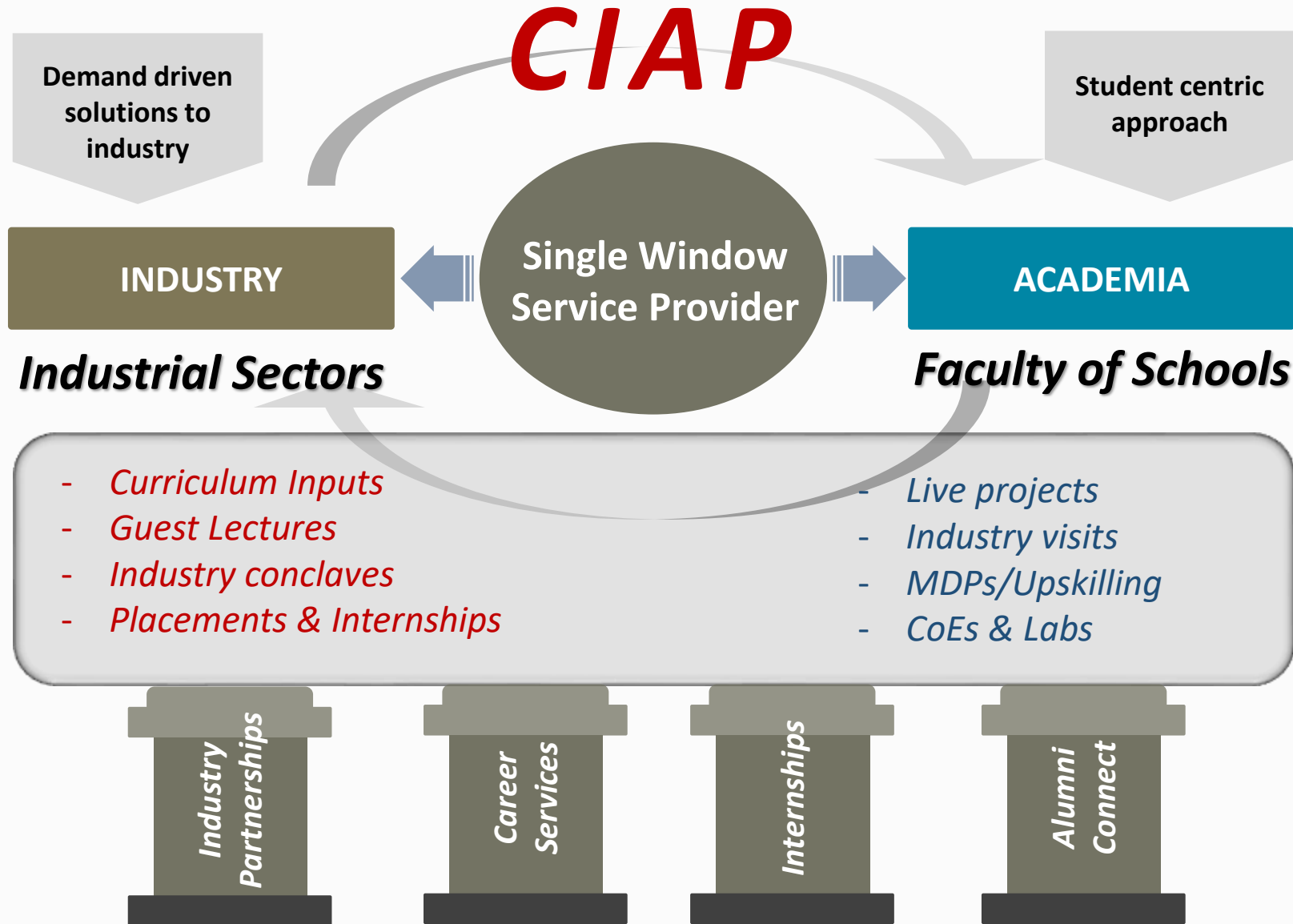
