Goal of the program: The goal of MIT WPU BBA (Liberal Studies) is that the learners will be able to serve the society as humanities leaders/ social leaders/ political leaders/ management leaders/ performing arts leaders/ administrative leaders and like that leaders in various domains of knowledge society.

BBA (Liberal Studies) Leadership program design is unique, integrated and interdisciplinary in approach and is based on blend of Specialization Courses in Management and Liberal Studies, Leadership Projects, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Peace (WPC), etc. This three-year program is spread over Nine Trimesters. The course is based on the choice-based credit system (CBCS) and learning outcomes-based curriculum framework (LOCF) which allow students to earn a part of their course credits by selecting subjects of their choice. From Second year students can select their specialization for major and minor. The program framework also provides for Open Electives, Cluster Electives, Co-curricular Courses, Internship, Dissertation and Yoga.

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Program Objectives

- To develop learners with Leadership knowledge & Skills
- To facilitate Learners to lead and manage individuals and teams as service-solution based Leaders
- To enable Learners to address self-development needs and interests through learning from various fields and disciplines including Management, Leadership, Humanities, Social Sciences, Arts etc.
- To train Learners as multi-skilled, multi-talented Leaders with integrated and interdisciplinary knowledge of various domains and skills.

Outcomes of the Program

Unique Salient Features of the Program

With Specialization I in Leadership Development (Service and Solution based learning) and Specialization II in one Elective from any one of the following domains; Management, Humanities and Social Sciences or Performing Arts.
- The Program has a unique Leadership Projects component which emphasizes on hands-on learning. With six dynamic courses that are practical-based, this component aims for development of holistic Leadership abilities.
- Each student will be connected to an Industry mentor of Director level and above. This Mentor will be connected with the student for the duration of all three years and the student would be

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spending at least 30 hours in total with the mentor. The mentor is expected to groom the student and make them industry-ready.

- Unique Open Electives such as Veda- Swadhyaya, Art History, Incubation and Startups and many more for a truly inter-disciplinary approach.
- An interesting basket of Cluster Electives that gives every student the opportunity to learn what they like.
- Interesting add on courses such as, 'Enhancing Employee Performance and Well-being through Leadership, Justice, Support, and Spirituality.'
- Experiential Learning in the form of Rural Immersion Project, National Study Project, International Immersion Project, Sports, Cultural Events, Seminars, Films and Documentary viewing, Biography Studies, Trekking and Field Trips and much more.
